# AFTER-SCHOOL/EXTENDED DAY PROGRAM:

Hello QCA Families! We are looking forward to a great year at **Extended Day!** The program will begin on Monday, September 11, 2023. The hours are 2:00-6:00 for preschool and K1 and 2:15-6:00 for K2 through Grade 8. On half days the program ends at 2:30.

This year each family will receive a student number that will be used to manually clock out your child/children from the program. If you do not clock out you will be billed for the entire day. Billing is by the hour. Please plan accordingly. Any family arriving after 6:00 on full days or 2:30 on half days will be billed one dollar per minute.

We kindly ask that all families send students with a snack and water. These items will not be provided by the school.

**Extended Day** is a great way for your child to have some time with friends in a relaxed environment after school. The typical schedule for the students is as follows: snack and free time, homework (staff can provide assistance), activity time (gym, playground, school yard, etc). ## **IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM MRS. SEARS:**

Greetings to new families and welcome back to those of you returning! If you don't know me yet, I am QCA's school counselor and I am excited to start another year with your child(ren). Over the past several years, we have covered a number of important topics such as integrity, respect, gratitude, self-control, friendship, grit, empathy/compassion, communication, choices, healthy coping skills, compromise, and commitment. This is more than just a social-emotional learning (SEL) curriculum; rather they are central values that are practiced on the playground, part of morning prayer and assemblies, and taught within and across all subjects. It does take a village to raise a child.

This year, our character development will be seen through the "ABC's of SEL", going through the alphabet covering topics such as identifying and managing emotions (especially the more difficult ones), conflict resolution, embracing diversity, and building a growth mindset.
