This announcement will be made over all the major television networks in the Quincy area. In addition, families will receive an Instant Alert text message through the Renweb Student Information system.

When there is a delay called in the city of Quincy, Quincy Catholic Academy will open at the following times: One-hour delay, school doors open at 8:15 a.m. One and one-half hour delay, school doors open at 8:45 a.m. Two-hour delay, school doors open at 9:15 a.m.

Please do not call the school, rectory, police, or fire stations concerning no school due to inclement weather.

What to Wear???

Since we only have three days of school next week, we will allow optional "*Dress Up and Dress Down*" each day. Please note:

On **Monday, December 18th** - Students involved in the Concerts are not required to be in uniform. Instead, all participants (Pre-K through grade 5) are encouraged to wear "**DRESS UP**" clothes (Christmas colors are preferred) for the performances. Middle School students may dress down in comfortable, appropriate "dress down" clothes.

On **Tuesday, December 19^h** – We will have an all-school **PAJAMA DAY** as part of the holiday fun! If students (and teachers!) have holiday PJ's, they are encouraged to wear them. Slippers are not allowed (for safety reasons), but sneakers and other comfortable shoes are appropriate. No "feetsie Pajamas, again, for safety reasons.
