Pokemon Club with William Huang and Stephanie Lyang



Grades: Students entering grades 1-5 (maximum of 15 students)

Dates: July 15-19

In the Pokemon Club (an Arts & Crafts style club), students will engage in different activities that spark their creativity. Students will perform different tasks ranging from decorating items to building projects from scratch. Science Exploration Club with Ms. Malatzky, MS Science Teacher



Grades: Students entering grades 4 and up

Session #1: July 15-19 **Session #2**: July 22-26

Enter the lab and get ready to explore! Each day students will explore a new science topic and take part in hands-on experiments. Students will learn how to design their own experiments and dictate what subjects we explore. One day we might make our own slime and bouncy balls and another we might explore the densities of different soda cans or find out how bath bombs work. The Science Exploration Club will challenge students to ask why and then try to answer their own questions through research and experiments. During the week students will also visit the Harvard Museum of Natural History to learn more about the natural world and inspire their investigations.
